



APPELLATE PRACTICE CERTIFICATION EXAMINATION



FORMAT AND SCORING

I. Exam Format

The Appellate Practice Certification examination is administered in two parts.

A. Part I

Part I will provide the applicant with the opportunity to demonstrate general knowledge, proficiency and experience in the core areas of appellate practice certification law. It consists of:

- 60 multiple choice questions, each worth 1 point.
- 10 short essay questions, each worth 12 points.

B. Part II

Part II of the exam will provide the applicant with the opportunity to demonstrate knowledge, proficiency and experience in appellate practice certification. It consists of:

- 5 short essay questions, each worth 12 points.
- 4 long essay questions, each worth 30 points.

II. Passing Standard

The Appellate Practice Certification examination is worth a total of 360 possible points. A passing score is 70% (252 points) or higher.

III. Scoring Procedures

The multiple choice questions are graded analytically. The essays are graded holistically on a scale of 1-6 and converted to analytical points.
