I was a trial attorney for 30 years prior to my appointment to the bench. I started my career in the Public Defender's Office where I served in every division of the office including the juvenile, traffic, misdemeanor, domestic violence, and felony divisions. I handled multiple bench and jury trials. When I left the office in 1999 I was handling first degree felony cases. I then transitioned into civil practice and worked at an insurance defense firm for a year before joining the City of Miami Office of the City Attorney where I handled cases in both state and federal courts. My practice at the City of Miami consisted of civil litigation in the areas of torts, civil rights actions, commercial and land use litigation. In 2010, I became Board Certified by the Florida Bar in Civil Trial practice. I was ultimately promoted to the position of litigation division chief and supervised trial and appellate lawyers. My litigation experience prepared me for the bench because I understand the rules of procedure, the rules of evidence, and how to evaluate legal arguments. My experience in federal court helped me develop my legal writing skills so that I can draft clear and concise orders.
